

Mountain school director, Pastor Cenet, shares how important this is:

"We have a garden programme at the school, but we are not able to grow enough food to feed all the students.

Now that we have money each month to buy rice, beans, oil and charcoal we can add our own fresh produce and feed each student and teacher... The teachers said they look forward to their students having better attendance and staying awake in class because they aren't hungry."

Teacher training is also vital. Only 6 out of every 1,000 teachers have a formal qualification in Haiti, so by equipping local teachers, many more Haitian children are able to receive a quality education. By purchasing our Teacher Training Freedom Gift, you enabled more teachers to study. Student teachers like Abigaëlle who grew up on the island and has always dreamt of being a teacher:

"My hope for the future is to finish with my studies and help the children and my family."

Finally, PiFò Haiti reached an important milestone in 2021 – 10 years of ministry and God's faithful provision! The team is now looking to the future, with continued expansion of its schools, more teachers graduating and the start of a food programme to provide for prisoners and their families. We can't wait to see what God will do through PiFò Haiti!

Earthquake response

Your astounding generosity supporting those who were impacted by the devastating earthquake, which struck the Tiburon Peninsula of Haiti in August 2021, helped to ensure that vital supplies reached those left homeless, injured or grieving.


Our partner on the ground in Haiti coordinated an emergency response in partnership with local church leaders, and in the months which followed helped people to rebuild their homes and livelihoods. Although far from the epicentre of the earthquake, those on the island of La Gonâve who PiFò Haiti

works with, also stepped in to help, distributing over 249,000 litres of clean water to the impacted areas.

Bringing hope amidst despair

When disaster strikes, our ministry partners are often the first to respond. They are on the ground so know their local communities, speak the language and can identify the need quickly. This is made possible by the faithful generosity of WorldShare supporters. Time and time again in 2021, you, our supporters, stood by our ministry partners when disaster struck, enabling them to bring hope amidst despair – thank you.

Life was thrown into panic in the city of Goma in the Democratic Republic of Congo, when on 22nd May 2021 Mount Nyiragongo erupted. Leaving in its wake destruction, lost lives and disarray as families were separated in the rush to escape. Goma is also home to the HEAL Africa hospital, which provides healthcare to those who would otherwise be unable to afford it. Thankfully the hospital was spared and was able to become a centre for supporting those impacted by the volcanic eruption and reuniting families. Tsongo Kasiki James, who heads up the hospital's Emergency Department and lost his home due to the eruption, shares his experience:

"With God's help, the family escaped safe and sound... During this disaster, HEAL Africa and its partners assisted us with an important amount of money that helped us recover. With this sum, we erected a temporary shelter where I am currently living with my family. There was also support in food...The fact that we had this support has given us even more relief by restoring our strength and hope."

"My grandmother could not afford to buy me school shoes and I would always admire my friends at school wearing their school shoes. So I am so happy and grateful that now I have school shoes which has been my biggest desire."

After her father died, left with no source of income, Sausia, her ten siblings and Mum were forced to move in with their grandmother. For years Sausia walked to school hungry, barefoot and in pain, but in 2021 that changed thanks to the generosity of Christian Fellowship Ministries and a child sponsor. Sausia is now walking to school with a smile on her face, shoes on her feet, food in her stomach, her school fees paid for and the hope of Jesus in her heart!
