Long-term Partnership Through the Storm



Yesterday, I was speaking in a church in Yorkshire from Micah 6 v 8. It is a verse that is often used by mission organisations, particularly those that focus on injustice.

But familiarity shouldn't lessen the value of reflecting on such a passage. Through his Prophet Micah, the Lord is asking the people of Judah a series of rhetorical questions to jog their memories about what it was that He had already done for them and, of course, for us.

So, what does the Lord require of us? To ... Act Justly, Love Mercy and Walk Humbly with our God. What do "acting justly" and "loving mercy" look like?

Well, since mid-March, the work of our partner ministry in Southern Africa has been dominated by responding to the impact of Cyclone Idai on people and communities in both Zimbabwe and Mozambique. These are people whose lives have been severely impacted; houses, crops and livelihoods have been destroyed.

The immediate acts of mercy in these situations have been: to provide food, shelter and to help communities get back on their feet; to act justly by the very practical matter of ensuring that widows, orphans and the disadvantaged are

included and receive an equal share of help.

The impact of cyclone Idai is not going to be felt over the short-term but will have a massive long-term impact on communities. Will you "walk humbly" before our God with us and continue to pray for the teams from Hope for Africa Missions as they minister to communities in the affected areas? Praise God that this is also an opportunity for many to hear to the good news!

I'd like to say thank you to our donors and supporters who've generously made this vital response possible.

In this edition of Window, we've taken "Long-term Partnerships Through the Storm" as our theme and, in the centre pages of the magazine, you will read how the ChildAid scheme is helping to transform young lives now but also having a real impact in transforming the lives of the next generation.



Long-term Partnerships Through the Storm



Here in the West, we are very accustomed to seeing profound humanitarian need displayed in tear-jerking high-definition across our 4K TVs and smartphones.

Whether Red Nose Day, Comic Relief or the Children in Need Rickshaw Challenge each year, we have never been so interconnected and, therefore, aware of international needs and the potential force of our collaboration. Whatever our charity or cause of choice might be, there are a multiplicity of socially-connected opportunities for us to fundraise, donate, sponsor a child, build a well, run a marathon or even erect an orphanage. Comic Relief alone, just this year, has raised a whopping £63 million!

As you go, proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give.

Jesus in Matthew 10: 7-8

But is it possible that we are missing something very obvious and something very doable?

Considering the increasing number of natural disasters we are currently witnessing around the world, and as impressive as these staggering figures above may be, there is another specific need of many of the people in hard-to-reach places at this time: long-term partnerships through the storm.

Talking in person with Bishop Hendrick Mahlangu (Director of Hope for Africa Missions) over conference call recently, here at WorldShare we have received a privileged insight into the plight of people in Southern Africa following the devastations of Cyclone Idai. Bishop Mahlangu told us that it will take at least 12 months for communities in Mozambique, Malawi and Zimbabwe to re-build their lives following the apocalyptic winds and rains that ripped through their homes and livelihoods.





Is there more we can do?

The emphasis that shone through very clearly from speaking with Bishop Mahlangu was of the desperate need of partnerships through the storm, as it were, so that ongoing support can be secured for the difficult years ahead.

In much the same way as a child in need might be sponsored by a family for years or even decades, so too do many devastated people groups need the regular, monthly, long-term support of finances from partners.

We praise God today for massive, one-off accumulative funds, as above, allocated to severe needs across the UK and the wider world. But we also pray for a growing gospel response to our suffering brothers and sisters in remote parts of the world who need us to hold their hands through the storm and beyond. Because most of us will not be able to do this literally, our hope is that many of us can still provide this support through the sharing of both our finances and our time in intercession.

CHILDAID: Could you help bring about change in a young life?

For those supporters that have been with us for a long time, you will be aware we have a sponsorship scheme called ChildAid. ChildAid works in partnership with local Christians in developing countries, to bring hope and practical help to many children and families.

We have no overseas staff; we rely wholly on the ministry team of our local partners. We have been working with some of them for over 50 years and each partnership is different.



Sponsorship through ChildAid benefits the whole community as well as the children who are sponsored. It is part of the holistic approach of our partner ministry, but it can also be a blessing to those who sponsor, as can be seen by their testimonies.



"I first heard about WorldShare when it was "Christian Nationals" when Chris Marantika from Indonesia came to speak at church. It was then that I heard about ChildAid.

I was at college at the time and I didn't take the opportunity for granted. I felt God was saying to me that he wanted me to give the gift of education to a needy child.

The benefits of being a sponsor are to know the children in the scheme are not just receiving an education but are getting the opportunity to hear about the unconditional love and grace of God.

Another benefit is that God has a plan for the children's lives. The children have dreams for their lives. God wants to give them hope and a future as it says in Jeremiah 29v11.

I don't have children of my own, but God has brought children into my life that need help. Hebrews 2v13 says "Here am I, and the children God has given me."

The children I have supported have sometimes been short term, others long term.

Child sponsorship is something I am passionate about. It is something that can be done without leaving your own doorstep."

We have sponsored children mainly from Guatemala, Myanmar and recently Albania. The benefits of sponsorship have been enormous: being able to pray for each one; knowing their name, favourite colour, hobbies or if they're struggling with school or not, you get to know your treasure as they truly are. To know that they can go somewhere safe, to know that they are getting an education to break the cycle of poverty, to know that their bellies are filled at least once a day and to know that their spiritual needs are



being met... these are hard things to put into word when you are part of it all. I probably will never know the depth of poverty nor the violence or uncertainty of their world but when I get updated photos and letters handwritten from these smiling, lovely precious children it reminds me of how good I have it. Even on my worst day, I can make a difference in someone's life. It has been humbling and fulfilling and every time I sit at my desk all their pictures are there smiling at me.

One young man, in particular, stands out as we sponsored him right through college. With his new job, he removed his whole family from an incredibly dangerous daily situation and was able to support them and begin a new life.

We have been blessed and I encourage anyone reading this, even if you can help just one, it will be so worth making a difference."

Transforming lives through sponsorship: Mandy's story...

ChildAid relies on the goodwill and generosity of sponsors to allow us to spread the word of God and enrich the lives of vulnerable children in the world's poorest countries.

One such sponsor is Mandy Pateman. In 1999, Mandy and her late husband sponsored Victoria Taiwoo, a 14-year-old growing up in Jos, Nigeria.

Their correspondence started with what Mandy fondly recalls as "really nice personal letters" and a close bond quickly formed. Despite the distance, their relationship has been one of closeness and mutual support, as Mandy reflects:

"I've been looking through some of her letters and things she sent me over the years. I found it quite moving to read it all. We've got a really lovely relationship. She had a good relationship with my husband too, she was very fond of him."

Mandy and Victoria also developed a spiritual connection through God. When Mandy's husband fell ill, she took comfort in the prayers offered by Victoria and her family when Victoria shared her vision from God that he would be with the Lord soon.

As a result of several bouts of Malaria as a child, Victoria often suffers from ill health, but Mandy's sponsorship has allowed her to live a good life. Now aged 35, she has a husband and child of her own and works to build a better future for her family:



"She got married about three or four years ago and they live in the bush somewhere so it's quite remote. She works with children, they run a school and she's been to university and done her training. She's done really, really well."

Though sending letters has become increasingly difficult, the pair keep in touch regularly through Facebook and phone calls when circumstances allow. The relationship that began 20 years ago remains a powerful force in both their lives:

"However long you sponsor a child for, it's amazing to know you're making a difference to their whole future."
