Celebrating 80 years of WorldShare



2023 marks WorldShare's 80th Anniversary and to start our celebrations we produced a commemorative booklet. As part of a fantastic response, our new CEO, Andrew, was able to meet and interview 96-year-old, Steve Juniper (pictured below), believed to be our longest standing supporter. We will be releasing this interview later in the year as we continue to mark this memorable milestone.

In February we launched our long planned 80th Anniversary Appeal, which we had to side-line temporarily following the devasting earthquake in Turkey and Syria.

The aim of this year-long appeal is to raise an additional £80,000, to enable growth and the development of new ministry partnerships. Our

partnerships. Our plan for 2023 and beyond sets out new activities to raise our profile, including:

Anniversary Appeal

- Exhibiting at some major Christian events between May & August 2023
- Creating new video content, to raise awareness of the work of WorldShare and our partners, for our social media platforms
- Building links with Universities & Colleges Christian Fellowship (UCCF) to reach younger audiences

As a result, here are some examples of increased costs this appeal seeks to fund:

- Exhibition fees & associated costs
- Purchase of a new camera & video editing kit



We are so grateful to you, our current supporters, who so faithfully pray for our work and give so generously, and we need more people like you who share the vision of WorldShare.

This appeal, therefore, reaches wider than just finance and asks you to consider alternative or additional ways of contributing through prayer, volunteering and by inviting us to your church.

Hope in the face of disaster in Turkey

In the early hours of Monday 6th February, a devastating earthquake measuring 7.8 magnitude hit southern Turkey, close to the border with Syria. There followed a series of aftershocks, one of 7.5 magnitude and another of 6.4 two weeks later near Antakya.

This has caused devastation in both Turkey and Northern Syria. At the time of writing almost 49,000 people have died, tens of thousands have been injured and thousands of buildings have been destroyed.

There are 17 million people that live in the affected area, many of them in urgent need of shelter, food and medical aid. Reports from those in the affected regions say that what has been shown on news media is just the tip of the iceberg.

As has been the case in so many previous disasters, WorldShare is able to assist in the emergency response. Through our ministry partner, Kanal Hayat, we have contact with churches and a local Christian emergency relief organisation who are all working in the disaster zones.



It has become an important mission of the entire Church of Turkey to heal the wounds that will last for many years.



Our Turkey-Syria Earthquake Appeal, once again, enables us to respond where needed.

Thank you to our supporters! To date we have already been able to send over £28,000 to Turkey via Kanal Hayat, First Hope Association and Antakya and Diyarbakir Evangelical Churches. Members of both churches, despite suffering personal loss themselves, immediately responded by serving their own communities by providing food, water, clothing, hygiene supplies and temporary shelter.

One victim said, "In the beginning, the Christians sheltered us in vehicles. They gave us warm clothing to wear, they gave us food to eat. The Christians met our immediate needs."

The Turkish Evangelical Church described the scene of Antakya as "worse than a war scene" and that the city is almost completely destroyed. Volunteers are actively involved in the preparation and distribution of three meals a day. Thousands of earthquake victims come to this distribution point.

First Hope Association (FHA) have set up at several disaster sites providing additional relief aid. They are running two mobile hygiene trucks that are constantly in use by both victims and relief workers. In addition, they have provided mobile shower and clothes washing facilities that are in operation constantly for ten hours a day. With the help of volunteer bakers, their bespoke mobile oven produces hot bread, pastries and cookies. This kitchen unit also provides breakfast by making unused bread into sandwiches.



They have also provided shelter and bedding to families who have lost their apartments. Hygiene kits, personal protection items, food boxes and many other goods are also provided for them as soon as they arrive at their new home. The necessary permissions from the official authorities to install a tent city have finally been granted and work has begun to get this in place. 1,000 family tents will be set-up together with beds, duvet covers, quilts, pillows, blankets and carpets.



With much of the aid from other organisations going to the immediate needs in Turkey, Kanal Hayat is currently planning a longer-term support and aid strategy through its network of churches across the affected region. Your donations will be both helping to address the immediate and desperate need, but also will be helping with longer term issues. Thank you.

These amazing responses by the local churches and aid organisations to those in need, are only made possible through your amazing and generous support of the people of Turkey and Syria.

Over £300,000 for Ukrainian refugees



A year on from Russia's invasion of Ukraine and there seems to be no end in sight to the devastation of war. In neighbouring Moldova, now home to some 85,000 refugees from Ukraine, tensions are high. The current energy crisis and attempts to destabilise the country keep Moldova under high risk. Despite this, our ministry partner in Moldova, Beginning of Life, continues to reach out with God's love to those displaced from their homeland.

Beginning of Life's holistic response to the refugee crisis has only been possible because of the generosity of you, our supporters. Of the total amount raised, half was thanks to WorldShare supporters, with the other half coming from our alliance partner in Canada.



The Beginning of Life team continue to assist refugees with practical items for those in need including food, hygiene supplies, clothing, shoes, school supplies, medication and kitchen equipment. They also continue to organise transport, accommodation and provide help and advice.

Many of the refugees are also being supported long-term through Beginning of Life's regular programmes including, Urban Kids, Urban Teens and Urban PAS. PAS is Beginning of Life's Psychological Art Studio which is playing a pivotal role in helping people deal with the psychological impact of the trauma they've experienced.

WorldShare's CEO, Andrew, and Finance Manager, Jenny, visited the Baltsata refugee camp during their visit to Moldova in January. Up to 250 refugees are hosted there, with mobile teams offering educational and therapy activities for women and children. Each week they carry out Bible studies along with games and other activities.

Beginning of Life have also been carrying out humanitarian aid deliveries into Ukrainian territory.

Thank you for being part of this amazing response to the needs of Ukrainian refugees in Moldova. Your support has funded not just the initial response to the disaster, but an ongoing programme that will continue to the end of 2023.

Our ChildAid programme is a great way of helping children receive a good education and a healthy meal every day, where they might normally not be able to.

This is done through our different ministry partners around the world. A lot of supporters like to see a child all the way through from a young age up until they finish at the project, usually when they're eighteen years old. However, if a child joins the project at a later stage in life or if they lose their sponsor, it can be difficult sometimes to find someone who wishes to sponsor an older child or teenager.

We currently have four girls and three boys that are in this situation at JKPS in India. Most of these children have about two or three years left on the programme and are looking for short-term sponsors.

Meet Suchana

Suchana is 16 years old and is sincere and diligent. She is in the 10th grade and her favourite subject is English. Her father works as a daily labourer and he is the primary breadwinner in the family. Suchana's mother works in a factory and also looks after the family. Suchana attends children's fellowship every Saturday and is very attentive. Apart from studying, she loves to draw and aspires to become a schoolteacher in future.

Launch of WorldShare 10:10 Partners

March 2023 sees the launch of a new initiative as part of our move forward in faith, WorldShare 10:10 Partners.

This project is aimed at raising support for new ministry partners and ventures and will feature greatly when we hit the road, promoting our work across the country, at a variety of Christian exhibitions and festivals this year.

The concept is simple, Jesus said in John 10:10, 'The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life and have it to the full.'

He also told his followers in John 14:12 that 'whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father.'

So, if Jesus came to combat the enslaving work of the enemy, by bringing life to the full, so we are called to do likewise. This includes providing opportunities, through new ministry partnerships to bring the Kingdom of God into people's lives who are excluded, marginalised and impoverished.

We are delighted to announce that our first 10:10 Partnership has just been agreed. Living Word of Faith Evangelistic Ministries are based in the Dome region of Accra, Ghana. In 2003, under the leadership of Pastor Samuel Amponsah, the church saw the need of local children and parents and established a nursery for a small number of under 5's to provide early childhood education to children of needy parents in the church and the community.

Over the past 20 years this has developed into the High Priest Academy, which has grown considerably. The school now has 130 pupils ranging from 2 – 15 years of age within Dome and other surrounding communities and has developed a strong reputation in the area of Ministry and Education focused on quality teaching and learning.



70% of the children that attend the school were enabled through scholarships provided by the church congregation. However, since the Covid pandemic, numbers returning to church have dropped considerably, as is the case in many locations globally. This means that the church has been struggling to continue to pay the 13 teaching, catering and cleaning staff. During 2022, staff were unpaid for three months and the situation has not improved. This obviously means that the future of the school is in jeopardy and thereby, the education of the children.

One of the key areas in which WorldShare serves is education and so through the 10:10 Partners scheme we are seeking to be able to assist in the monthly shortfall, to enable the children to attend school and receive a nutritious meal each day.

With the inflation rate in Ghana recorded at 53.6% in January 2023* the challenges are huge and this is why WorldShare wants to help, by enabling and equipping Living Word of Faith to continue its community transforming ministry in Dome.

On his recent visit to Ghana, Andrew signed a new ministry partnership agreement with Pastor Samuel Amponsah of Living Word of Faith Evangelistic Ministries. Stepping out in faith, WorldShare made an initial grant of £2,000 enabling the school to cover all salaries for the next four months. They also funded lunch for the entire school for one day.



WorldShare has entered into this partnership for a minimum of three years, to give the church time to recover



from the pandemic and be in a position where it is able to provide scholarships once again for the children.

This is where WorldShare 10:10 Partners will add another 'string to our bow' by creating resources that can be used to support struggling or growing ministries that are serving the Lord and transforming their communities through the Gospel.

11 families are already debt free



We are delighted to report that 48 families, across three brick kilns, have been supported during the first year of ChrisFon's Community Development Programme in Pakistan thanks to your amazing generosity through our 2021 appeal.

ChrisFon has worked hard to educate the brick kiln workers to break the cycle of borrowing from the kiln owners. Last December, all 48 families refused a loan offered by the kiln owners. 11 families are already debt free and the remaining 37 families have reduced their combined debt by 43% so far.

Christian Education

Throughout the year, all 48 families have increased their knowledge of God and they have also been taught to pray before they start their work, to ask God for His blessing.

Additional Income

All 48 families in the project are now raising at least one type of animal or bird including cows, goats, poultry, rabbits and pigeons to generate additional income. ChrisFon has also provided seeds to enable the kiln workers themselves to grow their own fruit and vegetables.

Healthcare & Education

At the start of the project, the brick kiln workers had poor health awareness. ChrisFon has educated the families in personal hygiene, most importantly hand washing and teeth cleaning, plus their medical officer ran a medical day camp at each of the three kilns.



Women's Development

Throughout the year, special attention has been paid to the development of women. ChrisFon has carried out the biggest distribution so far of sewing machines to kiln workers - to 40 families - as well as providing a stitching tutor. These women now feel respected and are not only stitching their own clothes, but also generating extra income.

Please thank God for a successful year and pray for the team at ChrisFon, particularly as they tackle the issue of adult literacy which is the most challenging aspect of the programme.

Thank you again for your support. You are part of a rare, successful, long-term intervention that is both liberating people and building vibrant communities of Jesus followers in Pakistan.

Over £12,500 raised for PiFò Haiti

In June last year we shared with you the basic but important needs of our ministry partner, PiFò Haiti. Thanks to your generosity in response to our appeal, all their needs were met – praise God!

Not long after the appeal, armed gangs intensified their control of strategic areas in Haiti including the main fuel terminal in the capital, thus preventing the distribution of fuel. The lack of access to fuel has harshly impacted businesses, schools, and hospitals and created shortages of basic goods including water and telecommunications. This means that prices skyrocketed and, as a result, some of the projects outlined in the appeal have been slower to implement than initially planned. Here is an update of the progress so far.

New classroom furniture

In both the city school and mountain school, new wooden benches have been made and the old benches repaired, plus lockable desks and chairs have also been made for the teachers. The teachers feel blessed and respected now that they are able to keep their personal belongings safe and no longer have to mark work on their laps.



The pre-school children also have new low tables and chairs for their classrooms. The new blackboards are pending due to the cost of plywood, but they will be purchased soon.

Community Garden storage

Work has recently started to build the storage shed for the community garden in Palma, up in the mountains. The workers have also been clearing the land ready for planting so that the garden can start to contribute to the local economy. Everyone is so excited to finally see progress and have asked us to pray for rain!



Food storage depot & office

Very soon work will start on the food storage depot and office for project manager, Emerson.

Please continue to pray for Emerson.
With the ongoing violence and political instability in Haiti, he feels the weight of responsibility as he responds to the needs of the island community of La Gonâve.

Extra blessings for Word of Hope

In September last year, Pastor Pau, ministry leader of Word of Hope in Myanmar, shared with us some urgent needs.

Thanks to your generosity in response to our appeal, over £13,500 was raised, not only meeting the need but blessing them with extra funds.

The most urgent request was to build new flood defences around the orphanage to protect it from flooding during the rainy season every year. You will see from the photo above that this work has been completed and that your generosity also covered the \$1,000 needed for the government building permit.

You may remember that the other requests included six laptop computers to assist and provide continuity in the children's learning, an electric bicycle for the Word of Hope team and basic solar equipment to enable the orphanage to generate electricity for lighting.





We are delighted to report that these were all provided for, as well as 55 new mattresses for the children to sleep on (which replaced old and water damaged ones).



Thank you for being a blessing to the 50 children being cared for at the Word of Hope orphanage in Myanmar. Many of them are orphaned, have been abandoned, or their parents are simply unable to afford to care for them.

Please continue to pray for Pastor Pau and the rest of the team at Word of Hope as they navigate life in a country embroiled in political and economic turmoil.


Impact of your giving in 2022



Much of this was in response to the terrible situation that unfolded in Eastern Europe, following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, with over £300,000 being raised to help support refugees both in Moldova and those still in Ukraine. This has funded, not just the initial response to the disaster, but an ongoing programme that will continue to the end of 2023.

In addition, WorldShare's ChildAid scheme continued to operate, with over 200 children receiving direct support through child sponsorships, and hundreds of other children being supported through the work of other similar projects.

As would be expected, with record income levels, expenditure also increased significantly, as we were able to support our ministry partners through a 30%

increase in the level of grants sent. It really has been a year in which we have seen such an upsurge in lives transformed in the name of Jesus Christ.

Thank you. We really could not do this without you!




